Abstract

2. The summary contains a minimum of 100 and a maximum of 150 words.
3. They embody, at least five keywords.
4. The keywords represent the most important variables and the population under study.
5. Keywords are not repeat words already used in the title or abstract.

Introduction

1. Clearly substantiates the relevance of the topic.
2. Clearly identifies the research that is located in the study.
3. Review background research relevant to the study.
4. Review findings and methodological issues relevant to the study.
5. Background research under review is updated.
6. Research outlines the main international and national authors have covered the topic under study.
7. The review of research leads logically to (l) purpose (s) of study.
8. Clearly understood (l) purpose (s) of research. .

Method

1. Described sufficiently, so that to repeat the study.
2. It is divided into subsections minimum: Participants, Definition of variables, materials (tools), Procedure, Design, Performance, Analysis.
3. Adequately describes the sample and participants (selection, sampling assignment to groups, if any, demographic characteristics).
4. The sampling method allows the generality of the results.
5. Clearly defines the variables under study.
6. Specify clearly how each variable was measured.
7. Describe the laboratory equipment, instruments, etc. employees.
8. If used questionnaire type instruments, tests, etc..., Presents data on its reliability and validity appropriate to the population to which participants belong.
